

Mt. Diablo Challenge 2022 Special Edition

Event Overview

On a beautiful fall day, Sunday the 2nd of October, 829 riders registered to climb more than 3,000 feet over the course of 11 miles to the Mount Diablo summit. This marked the 39th Annual Mount Diablo Challenge, now a memorial ride to honor the memories of Joe Shami and Joan Walt. Joe had just completed a streak of riding to the summit of Mount Diablo for 615 consecutive weeks when he was tragically killed by a motorist in a local traffic circle. Joan was an avid Mt. Diablo cyclist who sadly passed away some 40 years before Joe, succumbing to a heart ailment despite her youth. It was to honor Joan's memory that the Mt. Diablo Challenge was first organized by the Valley Spokesmen Bicycle Club. Other organizations have managed the event at various times during the ensuing years, but the Valley Spokesmen took over the Challenge again in 2017 and has hosted it since then.

This year's event saw hundreds of road cyclists, but also quite a number of mountain bikers, tandem riders, and even unicyclists and people striding on elliptical bikes. Prizes were given to the King and Queen of the Mountain and to top finishers in numerous age categories. The oldest male cyclist, William Oldham, was 84, and the oldest female rider, Shirley Osmer, was 86. At the other end of the age range, the youngest female cyclist, Elizabeth Long, was 11, and the youngest male rider, Shourya Patel, was 8.

Results

Quinn Felton won the KOM prize, with a time of 45:09.4, and Robin Betz captured the QOM title with a time of 59:35.2.
