We hosted the 47th Cinderella Ride with increased participation from the year before. Ken Hernandez and the Cinderella planning team have put together a new route and made several enhancements to make the 2024 ride an epic event. During the spring and summer months, we hosted several memorable rides, both in the Tri-Valley and beyond. We also hosted the Tour of Tucson in February and the Erie Canal Tour in September. Some of our dedicated members formed a committee and are planning several multi-day rides in 2024.

SBC ran a very successful Mount Diablo Challenge ride on October 1<sup>st,</sup> with increased participation from 2022. This year we added a separate category for e-bikes so more people can participate in the challenge. Raghu Venkata has already started planning for the 2024 version to build upon this success. As has been our tradition, a significant portion of the proceeds from the MDC were donated towards building bike turnouts on Mount Diablo.

s we close out 2023, VSBC has a lot to be thankful for. Our club has grown in membership, more riders are participating in our rides and new ride hosts are joining the existing ones to provide even more ride options for everyone. # **Bike Turnouts on Mount Diablo**



ount Diablo is a cyclist's dream that offers gorgeous vistas, great exercise, and thrilling descents. But for too many, it has been a nightmare when they encounter ascending vehicles in the downhill lane. The unfortunate result is an injured cyclist. However, in the last 8 years 45 bike turnouts have been installed on the paved mountain roads using the one-time \$1.5 million allocation from the state.

Those installments have reduced the bike vs vehicle collisions by over 80%. But the full plan is for 77 to be built to push the accident rate to near zero. With the coordination from California Outdoors Hall of Fame recipient, president of Mount Diablo Cyclists, and VSBC member, Alan Kalin, a fundraising effort for a "Phase 2" construction of the remaining 32 turnouts was kicked off last fall by a donation of \$123k from the estate of Joe Shami, the "Legend of Mount Diablo." The California State Parks Foundation received the

contributions and targeted them for the sole purpose of building the additional bike turnouts. With encouragement of Alan and the Mount Diablo Cyclists, VSBC members Mark Dedon, Rick Edmondson, Ted Trambley, Henry Turko, Debbie Wick, and several other passionate cycling leaders, an additional \$632k was raised for a total of \$755k! Beginning in the spring 2024, the additional

bike turnouts will be built. Using proceeds from the last three Mount Diablo Challenge events,



VSBC donated \$25k for this worthy cause. In addition, many VSBC members and cycling and safety advocates from all over the SF Bay Area and beyond, have added their own personal donations to this campaign. Thank you to all those who contributed to help make Mount Diablo a safer place for all mountain visitors! # Mount Diablo Challenge(MDC)2023

he 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Mount Diablo Challenge (MDC) was held on Sunday, October 1 on a gorgeous and sunny fall

day. For many participants, this event is a fitting culmination of their cycling training season. And for the MDC committee, the event culminates a year of planning that includes gathering sponsors, securing venue reservations, permits, insurance, and attracting more than 150 volunteers to support the event.



he MDC continues to commemorate Joan Walt, for whom the event was started more than forty years ago, and Joe Shami who became the

"Legend of Mount Diablo" with his amazing record of 615



consecutive weeks of cycling to the summit before his untimely death in 2021.

Earlier this year, the estate of Joe Shami donated \$123,000 for the construction of bicycle turnouts on



Mount Diablo to greatly improve bicycle safety. In summer, VSBC donated \$15,000 from partial proceeds of the last two MDCs. In October, VSBC donated another \$10,000 from a portion of the expected net proceeds from the 2023 MDC.

finished the 11.2mile, 3,249 ft.-ascending
course and then
celebrated their
achievement at nearby
Monte Vista High School
and adjacent Oak Hill
Park. This classic event

boy and girl were 6 and 12 years old, respectively. And the oldest man and woman were 85 and 87, respectively. While most participants were from

California, 13 states in all were represented plus a rider who was visiting from Japan. The fastest female finisher (aka



QOM- Queen of the Mountain) was Kristen Vetterlein with a time of 55 minutes and 26.6 seconds. The fastest male finisher (KOM) was Jovanni Stefani at 44 minutes and 49.3 seconds.
